

A function was held at The Dunes on Sunday 8th June celebrating the success of the 10th A Taste of Matarangi festival. In doing so the A Taste of Matarangi organising committee expressed their sincere appreciation to the many volunteers and sponsors who contributed once again to another special and successful festival.

The festival originally started in 2013 and is the undisputed highlight of our annual event calendar. 2025 saw the 10th A Taste of Matarangi being held due to a hiatus during the Covid years. The event has grown significantly since that very first year welcoming 600 attendees and in 2025 reaching 2,000 attendees.

"A Taste of Matarangi is proudly run by volunteers. Volunteers truly make the difference with their help in setting up/packing down the site and assisting on the day is essential to making things run smoothly and we were fortunate to have volunteers who showed real enthusiasm and a willingness to go the extra mile. Their commitment made our job just that little bit easier and for that, we are very grateful," said Bronwyn Ririnui, Festival Event Coordinator in her address to the gathered guests.

Bronwyn then went on to thank the local businesses, groups, and organisations whose generous sponsorship brought this event to life. "As we are not government-

funded, we rely on sponsorship and ticket sales, and every contribution goes a long way in helping make the festival a success," added Bronwyn.

Running such a festival is no easy feat and comes at great expense. The costs have grown enormously since the first festival with an initial \$21,000 in the early years to over \$60,000 more recently. This has been a huge achievement as expenses have especially escalated in the post Covid years.

This year the festival donated \$15,000 to our festival charity recipients: Kuaotunu Search & Rescue (KSAR) \$7000, Te Rerenga School \$4000, and the Coromandel Rescue Helicopter Trust \$4000. Mary Kedzlie, Principal of Te Rerenga School says "the school is so grateful for the continued support of A Taste of Matarangi with this year's generous donation going to the school's new astroturf, something we desperately needed with our growing school roll." Since its inception, A Taste of Matarangi has donated an incredible \$150,000 to charitable organisations in our community. "A testament to the power of community and what we can achieve together, said Bronwyn.

Bronwyn also acknowledged the hardworking festival committee. Over the 10 events, there have been 24

dedicated committee members contributing to organising the festivals and three committee members have been on the committee since day one, Kerre Baker, Maureen Moss & Bronwyn Ririnui.



MATARANGI **WASTEWATER PLANT**

This 7-year project is to upgrade the wastewater treatment plant to meet new discharge consent requirements and provide increased capacity to meet the future demand.

The principal driver this financial year is to maximise improvements to the effluent quality to lessen ecological effects and mitigate cultural

The project has a budget of \$765,118 of which \$60,115 has already been spent with a remaining \$135,118 over the next year.

The design will not commence until the conditions of Waikato Regional Council discharge consent are finalised.

The budget for obtaining the discharge consent is a separate project. Consultation with interested parties is continuing. The consent hearing has been re-scheduled by the Commissioners to late July 2025.

7.7% Rates Hike Locked In

The TCDC confirmed their plans and budgets for the coming financial year, with rates are going up by an average of 7.7% just as they forecast last year.

"Rising costs from inflation, water reforms, government changes to road funding and speed limits, and ongoing cyclone recovery repairs have made this a tough budget year, but we've made careful choices to stay on track," says the TCDC.

The question to be asked as average Matarangi rates are now hitting \$5000 p.a with half of those costs made up of charges to waste, fresh and storm water, is how can the TCDC in future start to control its own administrative and personnel costs? Will it put an end to the Matarangi Community collectively overpaying \$500000 p.a for its water services according to Grant Short's recent calculations?

A further question is with its new joint venture concerning water reforms - will they actually work? An issue that has not been explained is that the two councils who we are joining, fall under the BOP Regional Council in terms of overarching water resource management whilst we will still fall under in the Waikato Region.

Mercury Bay North Critical Structures Renewals

Renewal or reconstruction of damaged and poor condition foot bridges, stairs, platforms and other load bearing structures are planned to be cmpleted over the next year. The budget for this work is \$133,76.

So far renewal works have been completed at The Village Green stairs, the Gray's Beach Foreshore Reserve viewing platform, and the Wharekaho (Simpson's) Joesph Rd Beach stairs.

Engineers have design work underway for two pedestrian bridges in Kūaotunu, a viewing platform at Opito Bay, and two sets of beach stairs at Rings Beach.

They have also assessed the condition of the Ocean Close boardwalk. This work to be undertaken this year will depend on available budget; remaining works will be done in FY 2025/2026.

Based on the success of this venture Jackie and Martin hope to organise a follow-up community disco later in the year, the proceeds of which will once again go to a worthy local cause.

BLUFF ROAD CONNECTIVITY PROJECT UPDATE

This project is aimed at establishing the feasibility of the construction of a suspension bridge across the cove where the track is currently closed (although still being used).

Spanning between the two headlands of the cove the proposed bridge avoids the large and dangerous rockfall slip and restores safe cycling and pedestrian connectivity between the Matarangi and the Kūaotunu communities.

MRRAI, KRRA and our specialist suspension bridge consultant, DC Structures Studio along with TCDC are well underway with a feasibility study on this potential project. We have been consulting and receiving input from local iwi during the preliminary stages and have recently in early June met with iwi on the progress of the study. The scoping of the Resource Consenting process to inform the Feasibility Study is also underway. We envisage the draft of the Feasibility Study to be due in July.

We also need to undertake some geotechnical engineering investigations for the suspension bridge anchorages at each of the abutments to better inform the viability or otherwise. Additionally, there is also an updated assessment underway of the risks and stability of slips from Rings Beach to Matarangi scoped for a walking and cycling track

We envisage substantial progress on each of these engineering investigations by mid-August.

Considerable community consultation will commence subsequent to this initial feasibility work. Should the project proceed, it will need to be community funded and we are committed to open and robust communications should we proceed further as we will need strong community support.

TCDC Approves Joint Water Services

Thames-Coromandel District Council has voted to join with Tauranga and Western Bay of Plenty councils to form a joint water services delivery organisation that will comply with new Government legislation and future proof these essential services for our community. The decision to form a joint Water Services Organisation follows a year of research, meetings, workshops and community consultation.

In December 2024, Council narrowed down the options for future water services delivery under the Local Government (Water Services Preliminary Arrangements) Act to: an enhanced status quo (an internal water services unit) or; a regional/sub-regional Water Services Organisation. Other options were initially explored but expert advice found these not financially feasible. The Council consulted with our community between 15 April and 15 May on what its preferred option was. Local community catch-up sessions, online Q&A sessions and meetings with iwi contributed to our Council's conversations about which option would serve the district best.

A total of 241 public submissions were received, revealing 51% supporting our Council's preferred joint water services organisation delivery model compared to 46% of submissions supporting the internal business unit model. Another 4% of submitters did not specify a preferred option. As part of this consultation 69% of submitters advised that the key consideration for future water service delivery was affordability.

The staff analysis recommended forming a joint water services organisation with Western Bay of Plenty (WBOP) District and Tauranga City councils as the best option to provide future affordability for local ratepayers while providing a mechanism to influence the design of the new joint Water Service Organisation. Joining the Waikato

Water Done Well grouping of seven Waikato councils or the Hamilton City/Waikato District entity were also considered to be good options but not as strong as the Tauranga/WBOP

Seven councillors and Mayor Len Salt voted in favour of this option, with a potential start date of 1 July 2027. Two councillors voted against (Councillor Morrissey, Councillor

Council staff will now work with Tauranga and Western Bay councils to prepare a commitment agreement and joint implementation plan before reporting back to Council.

Chief Executive Aileen Lawrie noted "This is an important decision for council, which focuses on ensuring our water services will be delivered sustainably for future generations.".

A Water Services Delivery Plan will now be drafted up before being presented to the Department of Internal Affairs by 2 September 2025.

Stargazer Sight

July 2025

Elusive Mercury will be readily visible early in the month low in the west just after dusk. However, it gets ever lower throughout the month as it approaches the Sun and eventually becomes lost to view. Meanwhile slightly yellowish Saturn rises towards midnight and the Moon can help us find it along with somewhat reddish Mars but in the early morning this month. Brilliant Venus still dominates the dawn sky while bright Jupiter has past from behind the Sun and joins it lower down late in the month.

There will be many Chinese Tiangong and International Space Station (ISS) passes to enjoy this month but, as usual, timings may change especially towards the end of the month if they have to be moved to avoid space junk. Always best to check the website heavensabove.com for updated timings.

July 3- The Moon now sits just below and to the left of Spica in Virgo and we have a bright ISS pass from 5:42pm on the SW and then again at 7:19pm low in the west.

July $\dot{4}$ — We have a long ISS pass from 6:29pm in the SW.

July 5 - Another long bright ISS pass from 5:40pm in the SW.

July 7 — We have a long low ISS pass from 5:38pm in the SW.

July 8 — There will be a Tiangong pass from 5:59pm in the SW.

July 9 – Full Moon tonight.

July 10 - There is a long Tiangong pass in the west from 5:39pm.

July 13 — The almost full Moon sits high above slightly yellowish Saturn and to the left of the bright star Fomalhaut before midnight in the east.

July 14 — The Moon is now closer to Saturn and below Fomalhaut and early risers from 6:54am have a long bright ISS pass in the NW.

have a long bright ISS pass in the NW. July 15 — Saturn sits just below the Moon near midnight and from 6:04am there is a long ISS pass in the NW.

July 16 — Saturn is now above the crescent Moon towards midnight and from 6:50am there is a bright ISS pass in the west.

July 17 - There is an early ISS pass starting high overhead from 6:01am.

July 18 — We have an early ISS pass from 6:47am in the SW.

July 20 — The crescent Moon is now just above and to the left of Matariki at dawn with brilliant Venus much lower down.

July 21 — The Moon sits just below Matariki at dawn with brilliant Venus below and to its right.

July 22 — Brilliant Venus sits above and to its right.

Fight of the thin crescent Moon at dawn with lupiter just showing on the horizon to its right.

Jupiter just showing on the horizon to its right.
July 23 — A minute crescent Moon lies just to the left of Jupiter low down at dawn.

July 25 $\stackrel{\cdot}{-}$ There is an early Tiangong pass from 6:11am in the west.

July 26 - We have a long Tiangong pass from 6:48am in the west.

July 27 — At dusk a minute Moon sits just to the left of Regulus in Leo with slightly reddish Mars high above.

July 28 — The crescent Moon sits just below slightly reddish Mars at dusk.

July 29 — The Moon now sits just above Mars at dusk.

July 30 — The Moon is now high above Mars at dusk and at dawn from 6:12am in the south we have an ISS pass moving beside the Southern Cross.

July 31- The First Quarter Moon is high above Mars and directly to the left of the bright star Spica in Virgo.

August 1 — We have an early ISS pass in the south from 6:04am.

 $\mbox{August 2}-\mbox{From 6:47am}$ in the SW we have a long bright ISS pass.

Ten year ago in the July 2015 edition of the MBP we reported on local Matarangi Fire chief Stu Arnold being awarded Volunteer of the Year Award – Runner Up by Volunteering Waikato. Paul Shaw organised the nomination and had Stu up against some pretty serious players including people from the New Zealand Red Cross, Waikato District Health Board and the Stroke Foundation.

We also had an article about how the Kuaotunu Hall is continuing to evolve as an iconic hub for our local communities. In 2015 a lot of progress was being made in the restoration of local artifacts and landscaping around the hall. The Kuaotunu Hall today is a wonderful survivor from the 19th century that still plays a wonderful community role in the 21st century. Many small rural halls over the last 50 years have fallen into disrepair or have gone all together.

We also had a wonderful story about long-time local the late Louie Holzgang and his fifty year old apple juicing system made with an old Hoover motor and a handmade drum studded with screws to shred the apples and a hand press with a six ton jack. The apple shredder and press is based on what Louie saw as a young boy growing up in Switzerland. In 2015 it was still in operation and brought the whole family together from Louie through to his great grandchildren. The apple juice is called Most in Swiss. The family also made apple cider vinegar.

In other news, figures for the first six months establish that in excess of 6000 walkers have been recorded walking the Bluff Track and that eleven brave locals took to the Matarangi Beach surf for the 2015 mid-winter swim. In 2014 there were only six participants! The late Trevan Smith, who along with his wife Carol, started the annual Matarangi mid winter swims, would be absolutely delighted to hear that 11 years later, ten times that number showed up in 2025!

Matarangi Reserves Management Group: Mid-Winter Update

As a group the MRMG want to let our friends and neighbours know what we do as a committee, if you didn't know already.

Principally, as a group we have our ear to the ground listening to what the nice people of Matarangi are thinking about, and what they would like to see happen in the area in the future. The committee, with its excellent relationship with the council are committed to being the ears for the TCDC and will hand the wishes on to the right people.

Our group has plenty of great ideas to improve the wellbeing of our community but it's not as simple as to plonking a seat on a reserve or tennis court as people imagine. Every idea no matter how big or small must be discussed through the right channels.

The staff at Park and Reserves must follow the H&S guidelines and be seen to be using approved contractors to carry out the work. Budgets must be seen to be met.

This year the budget at the council is tight but some of the

issues that we have put forward to the council have been attended to.

Examples.

*Street signs have been replaced or repaired quickly.

*The palm trees in Mercury Views have been trimmed back to a much better height.No more scratched cars!!

*A large tree that fell across an access way to the beach from Kenwood Dr has been removed.

If you have seen something that needs attention don't hold back from using the TCDC WEBSITE and searching the RFS page in to log in a job. It's a very easy way to get quick access to help. If you have any ideas for improvements to our beautiful corner of the world, let us know, or put your hand up and join the committee.




